<b>Course Overview</b>	<p><u>Aims:</u>            Morphology II is a follow-up course to Morphology I. It deals with the system of English verbs and verbal categories. Other topics involve pronouns, adjectives and adverbs. Students will develop theoretical knowledge of grammar and will grasp the differences between two different language systems (Czech and English).</p> <p><u>Topics:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
